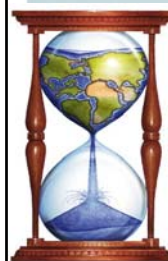
USR Framework

Alshuwaikhata & Abubakarb (2008), → a framework → overcome the limitations and constraints of the current environmental management practices in universities.

The aim of the model is to foster →

more campus sustainability through the integration of three main strategies such as the university Environmental Management System (EMS); public participation and social responsibility; and promoting sustainability in teaching and research

University Social Responsibility USR ?



Academic knowledge is expected to be based on real life circumstances and connected to practice, the need to strengthen civic engagement, social responsibility and active citizenship at universities should be further stimulated (Ledic, Culum, Nuzdic, & Jancec, 2008).

The Eller College Philanthropy [\[1\]](#)

The Eller College Philanthropy [\[1\]](#) is encouraging students, faculty, staff, and alumni to join forces to provide social services to their local community service organizations such as painting, building, cleaning and so forth. In 2004, some 300 volunteers provided services to 28 local organizations.

University Social Responsibility USR definition?

- Reiser (2008) defines the **USR** concept as “a policy of ethical quality of the performance of the university community (students, faculty, and administrative employees) via the responsible management of the educational, cognitive, labor and environmental impacts produced by the University, in an interactive dialogue with society to promote a Sustainable Human Development” (Reiser, 2008).

University Social Responsibility (USR) definition?

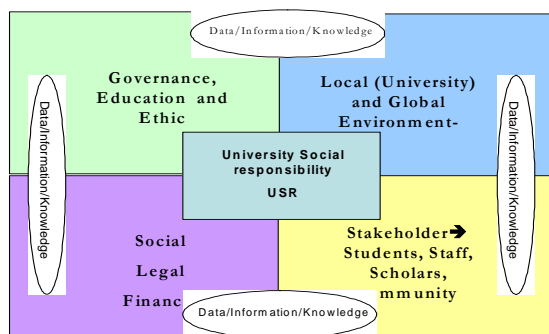
- **USR** as “an ethical approach to develop a sense of civic citizenship and socially responsible students, academic staff and faculty members in order to promote social, ecological, environmental, technical and economical engagement for a long lasting and sustainable local and global community”.

LINKING ICT AND USR

As an enabler, **ICT** is usually perceived to be a positive means in the ongoing transformation process within education, governance, industry, socio-economic development and so forth.

One societal obligation for the university → specific mechanisms to access information and data via the use of the ICT → Many students still do not have access to Internet → **progress towards an inclusive and equitable knowledge society is regarded as necessary.**

University Social Responsibility model

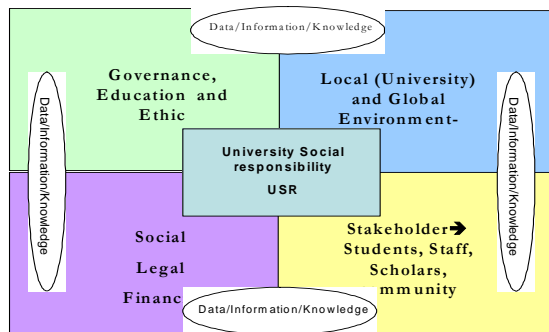


LINKING ICT AND USR

Internet technology has contributed to change the way internal and external communications is taking place.

In addition, with the emergence of Internet, **news ways of teaching and learning is taking in place.** Distance online learning or videoconference could reduce the need to travel and impact favorably on the environmental pollution

LINKING ICT AND USR

University governance good practices → good reporting processes with the aim to promote **disclosure, transparency and accountability**.

The use of IT is very important in order to implement a regulatory system.

USE accounting IT systems or online payment student fees, → improve **university governance standard** → But costly !!

One common factor in 4 dimensions of USR framework is related to data, information and knowledge processing.

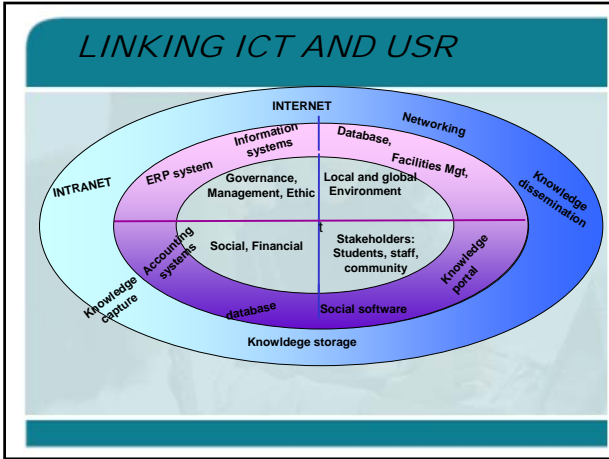
the use of ICT is primordial in the area of data and information acquisition, storage, search and dissemination processes.

LINKING ICT AND USR

The emergence of **social software** → community building or connecting various stakeholders

Nowadays, several universities have encouraged initiatives from students in setting up a wiki as platform to share knowledge.

Another example fostering e-learning concepts is based on [wikiversity](#) ^[1] or several emerging collaborative tools.



Conclusion
